STICKING TO THE SCRIPT

In this day and age, for most of us, seeing the world like an unfolding movie is inevitable. As we all know, in the process of making a movie, sometimes an actor will “ad-lib” – creating a line or emotion on the spot. And sometimes it turns out to be in a flow with the original script. Likewise, brethren, our teaching and prophecy must be in line with what is written (Isa. 8:20). But sometimes an ad-lib will contradict the director's ideas, but turn out to be more effective than what was in the original script. This happens often in Hollywood.

But when it comes to the Masterpiece of the Most High, how can any man improve His script? How can any man improve His casting? How can any man improve His direction? Selah.

This servant is fully persuaded that we as the remnant must make a conscious effort to honor our YAH-ordained roles. We must stick to the Divine Script; always resisting the temptation to envy our fellow “actors” who have bigger parts, or to “add our two cents” to His perfect mix. To be sure, as children of the Most High, our opinions are not without purpose or value. And our inspired words, in line with, and building upon the Script, are necessary (Jer. 3:15).
