*Prophetic Revelation*

## **THE TWO HOLY CITIES TO COME**

My beloved brethren, as we all know, the apostle Yahchanan-John recorded for posterity in the book of Revelation that the eternal dwelling place of Abba YAH and Messiah Yahushua is the Holy City, New Jerusalem. And yet according to the prophecy, there will not be a temple in the New Holy City. As it is written, "...I saw no temple in it, for the LORD GOD Almighty and the Lamb are its temple." (Rev. 21:22).

Now, the prophet Yakhezqel-Ezekiel *also* received a revelation about a New City. And the city he foresaw *does* include a new Temple. As it is written, "And He (YAHUWAH) said to me, 'Son of man, this is the place of My throne and the place of the soles of My feet, where I will dwell in the midst of the children of Yisrael forever.'" (Ezek 43:7). Clearly, the prophecy in Ezekiel reveals that Abba YAH and Messiah Yahushua will dwell in a new Temple, located in a new city.

So how is it then, my brethren? Are there actually *two* holy cities prophesied to come?

To begin with, throughout his entire book, the city revealed by Ezekiel is never referred to as 'New Jerusalem.' SÉLAH. And secondly, the name of the new Holy City is included in the prophecy – and it is not New Jerusalem... As it is written, "...the name of the city from that day shall be: 'YAHUWAH is there.'" (Ezek. 48:35). So the name of the new city to be built in the "Middle East" will be 'YAHUWAH Shammah,' and *not* 'New Jerusalem.'

The Ezekiel prophecy specifies that this new city – which includes a new Temple – will be built somewhere in the land originally allotted to the twelve tribes of Yisrael. And according to the

measurements the prophet received, the new city in eretz Yisrael will be 122.5 miles long on each side, creating a 450-mile city-square ‘circumference.’

Now the state of Israel as it currently exists is about ninety miles wide at its broadest point. So obviously, the Temple Mount in the Old City alone, even if the ancient City of Dawid [the original Jerusalem] is included, is not nearly large enough; and therefore cannot be the full location of the new city recorded in Ezekiel. And in truth, the New Jerusalem seen in the book of Revelation *cannot* be the same city as the one specified in the Ezekiel prophecy, which will be built on the ‘Arabian plate,’ and *will* include a new Temple building.

Notice, brethren, that historically speaking, the United States is the land of “The New.”

For example, cities and states whose names include the word ‘New’ is a recurring theme across America – as in New England, New York, New Orleans, New Jersey, and so on; with most names being taken from a city or state in the “Old World” of the Eastern Hemisphere. And needless to say, the U.S. is far and away the preeminent power in “The New World.”

Now, according to the Hebrew tongue as spoken in the state of Israel, and in keeping with *the historical purpose* of America, the Israeli School System teaches its students that the U.S. is “The Land of the New Promise,” or “The Land of the New Covenant.” So then, will the New Jerusalem seen by Yakhnan-John in the Revelation exist in a different time period than the new Holy City recorded in Ezekiel? “Mainstream” eschatology says an unequivocal yes...

But could it be, beloved saints, that there will be *two* eternal cities – with one in eretz Yisrael, and one in the ‘New Promised Land’ of America? Surely, the “\$64,000,000 question” among Hebrew Yisraelites for 2021 and beyond will be: is America the location of “The New Jerusalem?” SÉLAH.
